Reed Gold Mine State Historic Site Summer Camp Scholarship Policy 2006

Financial assistance is available to those who otherwise could not participate in a Junior Prospectors Summer Camp. A scholarship committee will consider each request individually. Registration begins **April 15, 2006.** Scholarship requests are considered on a first-come, first-served, rolling basis. Anyone interested in nominating a child for a needs-based scholarship the Reed Gold Mine summer camp should submit the following information:

- A completed registration form for camp.
- A letter nominating the child for the scholarship. A parent, teacher
 or other adult may write the letter. It should outline why financial
 assistance is necessary and why the child would like to attend and
 would benefit from the camp.
- Any other supporting materials, which the nominating adult thinks the scholarship committee, should review. This might include a letter from the child, parent, teacher, or other adult who is not the nominating adult. No financial records are required for consideration.
